



# Frequently Asked Questions STH 113/North Main Street Utility Improvement Project

1. **Where is the project?** STH 113/North Main St (STH 60/Lodi St to ALKAR-RapidPak, Inc.)
2. **What work is being done?**
  - Water main installation by directional drilling (HDD) and service lateral replacement.
  - Select sanitary sewer main and manhole replacement (open cut).
  - Water and sewer lateral replacement (open cut).
  - Sanitary sewer rehabilitation (Cured-in-place Pipe Lining CIPP)
  - Roadway restoration of any disturbed:
    - Asphalt/Concrete roadway
    - Concrete curb and gutter
    - Driveway apron
    - Sidewalk
    - Turf
3. **What is the construction schedule for the proposed project?**

Utility construction is anticipated to begin by mid-March 2023 and be complete by May 27, 2023. A WisDOT mill and overlay project will follow.
4. **Will there be a detour?**

Yes. STH 113/N. Main St will be detoured along STH 60 and STH 188. During construction, there will be a period when the Main Street/Lodi Street intersection will be closed to north-south traffic. During this stage, STH 113 traffic will be routed to the posted detour via Pleasant Street.
5. **Will sidewalk on my street be replaced?**

Yes. When required, select sidewalk panels will be removed and replaced for service lateral construction.
6. **Will there be landscaping associated with this project?**

Yes. Disturbed turf areas will be re-seeded and mulched as part of the utility replacement work. Property owners are encouraged to water and care for the new seeding.
7. **Will trees be removed?**

Tree removal is not anticipated unless there is a service lateral conflict.
8. **How is the project paid for?**

The utility project will be funded by sewer and water utility revenue and utility borrowing.
9. **How will the project affect access to my driveway?**

Generally, the contractor will be required to provide access to homes at the end of the working day and on weekends. As with any construction project, there may be periods when driveways are inaccessible, such as when underground utilities are installed or while concrete curb and gutter, driveway aprons, or sidewalks are installed. Vehicles will be prohibited from crossing the curbs, aprons, or sidewalks during the 7-10 day curing period for concrete.

10. **Will access for emergency vehicles be maintained?**  
Yes. The contractor is required to accommodate emergency vehicles at all times.
11. **Will mail be delivered during construction?**  
Mail delivery will be maintained at select locations coordinated with the post office. Property owners are encouraged to arrange to pick up mail at the post office during construction.
12. **How will garbage and recycling be collected during construction?**  
Garbage and recycling collection may vary from week to week as construction changes and progresses. If the garbage and recycling trucks cannot access the pick-up points, the City and/or contractor will coordinate to pick up the garbage and recyclables to move them to the closest intersecting street for pick up. **Please put your address on your trash and recycle bins so they can be returned to the correct property owner.**
13. **Will any work take place on private property?**  
The contractor may need to do limited work on private property near the street right-of-way to repair sidewalk or to match existing grades. The contractor will be responsible for restoring any areas of private property disturbed by construction operations to a condition as good, or better than existed before the construction.
14. **Will water service be interrupted?**  
Water service may be interrupted for short periods of time during various stages of the water main installation. The contractor will be required to notify all residents prior to any planned interruption of water service. Interruptions to water service exceeding 8 hours or overnight will not be permitted. There may be situations where an inadvertent shut-down becomes necessary. The contractor and the City will notify residents and resume service as quickly as possible.
15. **Will sanitary sewer service be interrupted?**  
Sanitary sewer service will be maintained at all times in areas of sanitary sewer replacement. The contractor will be required to notify all residents 24 hours prior to any extended interruption of sanitary sewer service.
16. **Private Utilities**  
Private utilities (CATV, Phone, Internet, Gas) have coordinated facility replacement or relocation with WisDOT.  
  
**Persons with special needs should inform the City or the Engineer if accommodations are needed during construction.**
